Parents and Students,

As I am sure you are aware, Governor Reynolds issued a new proclamation on Tuesday that has an effect on the number of spectators we are allowing at our Ballard activities. According to the proclamation, each athlete/performer is allowed a maximum of two spectators. This will have the following impact on our activities:

- 1. The only spectators allowed at events are the two spectators connected to each athlete/performer. Families need to coordinate in advance who will be attending so we can make sure everyone who arrives is able to gain admittance.*
- 2. This means unfortunately at this time, students will not be allowed to attend competitions as fans unless they are one of the individuals connected to the family of an athlete/spectator.*
- 3. There will be a check in sheet at the ticket window/table for individuals to check in with the athlete/participant they are connected to for the competition. Once two individuals have been checked in there will not be any additional spectators allowed in for that athlete.*
- 4. All spectators will still need to buy tickets or have a conference pass. Tickets will be sold at the ticket window/table.*
- 5. We still ask that, if possible, spectators arrive only for their child's level of competition and leave when they are finished competing.*
- 6. Different schools will be following different procedures in regards to the two-spectator limit. This information will be passed along through the respective coaching staff, Bomber Beat newsletter, twitter (@BHSbombers) account, and the facebook (/bhsbombers) account.*
- 7. We will evaluate the use of concession stands for our middle school and high school events. Food will not be allowed in to the gym only drinks.*
- 8. Masks are required for the duration of your visit.*

We know this situation is not ideal, but we are doing the best we can to keep our programs running and our students and community safe. The proclamation from the governor is in effect currently through November 30th. As with everything this year, the situation is fluid and could change at any time. We will continue to keep you updated as we receive more information.
