



#### Drive Clicked

Story City gained more yardage passing with 84 compared with Ballard's 82, Ballard intercepted three Viking passes while Story City couldn't steal any.

On fumbles, Story City lost the ball four times while Ballard lost it three times. The Vikings punted four times averaging 191/2 yards per punt while Ballard punted three times averaging 29 yards per punt.


