DIRECTIONS

This survey asks questions about your experiences in school. All your answers are confidential, and the survey results will not be reported in a way that will make your answers available to anyone else.

Read the introduction before each section and the questions carefully. In this survey, there are no right or wrong answers, and it is important that you give your honest opinion.

If you have difficulty answering a question, go on to the next one - you can always come back. If you prefer not to answer a question, don't understand a question, or can't answer a question truthfully, leave it blank. You can ask your teacher for help if you don't understand a word or what the question is asking.

Once you click the SUBMIT button at the end of the survey, your responses are saved, and you cannot go back to change them.

These questions will ask you about your school this school year. Some of the questions are about rules. When you see or hear the word "rule", think about the expectations your teacher has for you in the classroom, or the rules that everyone follows in the school.
